## Marshmallow Catapult

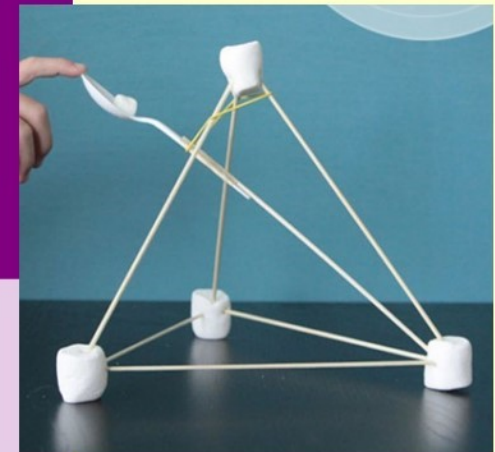
What can you do with left over marshmallows? Well you could toast them over a campfire, or pop them in a cup of hot chocolate; OR you can launch them from your very own **HOMEMADE MARSHMALLOW CATAPULT!**

### What You'll Need

- ⇒ Wooden skewers
- ⇒ Thin rubber band
- ⇒ Masking tape
- ⇒ Plastic spoon
- ⇒ Marshmallows

### Instructions

- ⇒ Using 3 marshmallows and 3 skewers, form a triangle by pushing the skewers into the marshmallows.
- ⇒ Using 3 more skewers and 1 more marshmallow, form a pyramid.
- ⇒ Tape the plastic spoon securely onto the end of another skewer.
- ⇒ Loop a thin rubber band around the topmost marshmallow, then insert the spoon skewer through the rubber band and into one of the marshmallows at the base of the pyramid.
- ⇒ You should now have a homemade marshmallow catapult ready to play with. However, because fresh marshmallows are quite fragile and will easily break, it's recommended that you let your catapult sit out overnight so the marshmallows dry out and harden up. This way they become much stronger and you will be able to play with your catapult for a longer period of time.
- ⇒ NOTE: You can also leave the marshmallows out of their bag for a day to harden up **before** you use them to build your catapult.
- ⇒ For extra fun, use the masking tape to mark out a target on the floor and then take turns trying to hit the target with your marshmallows!

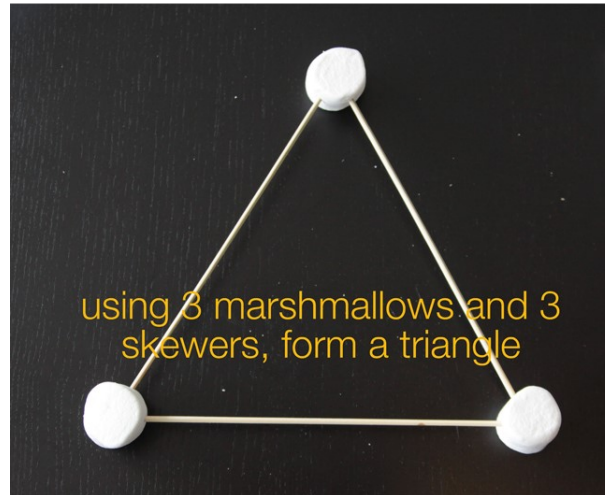


# HOW TO BUILD A MARSHMALLOW CATAPULT

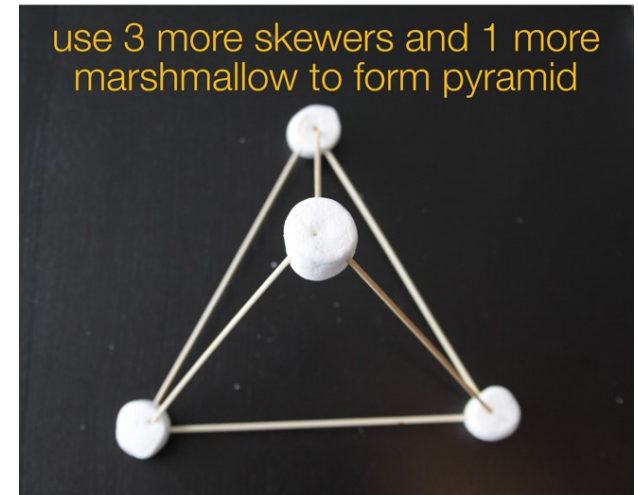
supplies: skewers, rubber band, masking tape, plastic spoon, large marshmallows



using 3 marshmallows and 3 skewers, form a triangle



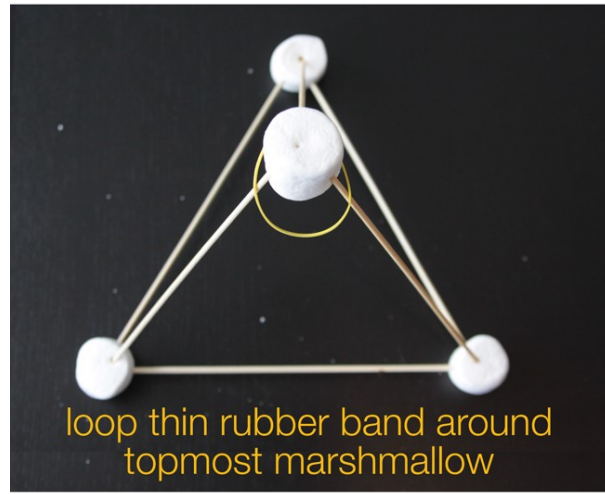
use 3 more skewers and 1 more marshmallow to form pyramid



tape plastic spoon securely onto the end of another skewer



loop thin rubber band around topmost marshmallow



insert spoon skewer through rubber band into one of the base marshmallows
