






























Paper Plate Sun Catcher Poppy

* Scissors


* Tape

Materials:

- * Black Marker
- * Red Tissue Paper


Steps:


- 1. Assemble materials
- 2. With the Black Marker draw a dot in the centre of the Paper Plate
- Draw two petals either side of the dot so that it looks like a Bow Tie
- Draw two semi-circles either side of the Bow Tie to complete the petals
- 5. Thicken the Black Marker Line
- 6, 7. Using Scissors cut all the white areas of the Paper Plate out
- 8. You now have a Black outline remaining
- 9. Cut 4 pieces of Red Tissue Paper. One for each petal
- 10. Fold each of the pieces of Tissue paper like a concertina
- 11. Pinch and tape one end of the Tissue Paper to create a fan
- 12 On the back of your Poppy out line, tape each fan of Tissue Paper to the space of each petal shape
- 13,14. Repeat until all Tissue Paper Fans are taped on
- 15. Cut off excess Tissue Paper
- Display finished Poppy in a Window to catch the light.














Egg Carton Poppy

Materials:

- * Egg Carton
- * Scissors
- * Red Paint * Paint Brush
- * Black Marker

Steps:

- 1. Assemble materials
- 2. Using scissors cut the Egg Carton apart into individual sections
- 3. Cut down one Egg Carton section to desired shape
- 4. Cut slots to dive petal shapes
- 5. Cut and Round petals to desired look of Poppy shape
- 6. Paint the Poppy Shape with Red Paint. Leave it to dry
- 7. Using a Black Marker colour a dot in the centre
- 8. Finished Poppy
- 9. Repeat to create a Poppy Wreath
















Paper Plate Poppy

Materials:

- * Paper Plate
- * Scissors
- * Red Paint
- ors Manluan
- * Paint Brush
- * Black Marker


Steps:

- 1. Assemble materials
- 2. Place a Paper Plate on the table
- 3. Paint the Paper Plate with Red Paint
- 4. Once Paper Plate is completely painted set it aside to dry
- 5. With the Black Marker draw a dot in the centre of the now Red Paper Plate
- 6. Draw two petals either side of the dot so that it looks like a Bow Tie
- Draw two semi-circles either side of the Bow Tie petals to complete the petals
- Using Scissors cut the shape of the poppy out
- 9. Finished Poppy

Alternative Ideas:

 Instead of Paint to colour the Poppy Red use a Red Marker and get creative with your design

ANZAC Day Milk Bottle Lantern

Re-use old plastic milk bottles and turn them into beautiful lantern tributes to our ANZACs.

How to create your own ANZAC Day Lantern:

- 1. Cut a plastic two or three litre milk bottle in half, wash it out well and allow to dry. The bottom half of the bottle becomes your lantern,
- 2. While the lantern is drying select which images you wish to place on it, then either print them off or draw them on a piece of paper.
- 3. Once the lantern is completely dry, place your images on the inside and use permanent markers to trace the images onto the outside of the lantern. You can colour in your images if you prefer, or leave them as an outline.
- 4. Your lantern is now ready to use. Lastly, weigh your lantern down with a small layer of sand in the bottom, then carefully place a tea light candle inside, ready to be lit at dawn on ANZAC Day.
